## Commissioner Michelle Rodriguez – who raised more than \$114,000 in December – announces her candidacy for 53<sup>rd</sup> State Assembly seat

She earns endorsements from 25 current and former legislators as she launches campaign for seat currently represented by Freddie Rodriguez

(Pomona, California) – Michelle Rodriguez, a member of the Commission on Peace Officers Standards and Training (POST), announced today that she raised \$114,000 in the twenty-two days before the new year for her campaign to succeed her husband, Assemblymember Freddie Rodriguez in the newly-drawn 53<sup>rd</sup> District. The election is on March 5, 2024.
